The twelve short stories contained in this collection take place around Buriti Pequeno, a make believe city in the heart of central Brazil. Paulinny Tort brings to the surface a central and delicate spot in Brazil's identity and tells us about the patriarchal structure of families, about daily life in a rural environment, about its most religious nuances, and about the unstoppable power of nature when it defends itself from the action of humans. Tort highlights as well the blend between native and Afro-Brazilian cultures, a fascinating aspect that finds its space in all the stories.

The precise writing and its captivating rythm invite the reader to dive into the powerful imaginary of these stories and into the sharp irony that draws the shape of an enchanting and cruel country.
